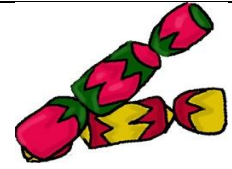

## Christmas Carols in Maer - Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> December.

The Covid regulations mean at the moment there can be no singing inside the church this Christmas.

**BUT.....**Arrangements are in place for a very different Carol Service in Maer this year. It is going to be impossible to have the usual convivial, warm, packed event with carols ringing out and the Church bedecked in its Christmas finery. However there will be a service in Church and afterwards (weather permitting), carols will be sung outside.

**SO**

On Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> December **at 3 pm**, there will be a short said service of Christmas Communion IN the Church, then, as it goes dark and the lights come on, a (socially distanced) procession will come through the village, singing carols. The words to the chosen carols are on the sheets attached so please bring them with you.

Gather outside the Garden House (Elena's) **at 3.45** for this.- bring lanterns and torches



We'll process to the Village Hall, where there will be a short service, led by the Rector, including community carols, followed by mince pies and mulled wine.

People are welcome to join the Church service at 3 pm, the procession at 3.45 or the Carol Service (or even just the mince pies and mulled wine – **about 4.30!**).

Any of these or all of these!

We are hoping for a dry afternoon, but do come wrapped up with warm coats and boots and regrettably, if it rains, we will have to cancel the Carols.

But Christmas in Maer is definitely NOT cancelled this year and I'm praying for a fine day.
